AT SAMARITAN CENTER OF PUGET SOUND

We are a program of Samaritan Center of Puget Sound providing counseling and mental health services to those limited by finances in their access to care. The therapists who meet with clients in the clinic are post-masters clinicians who desire to grow in their profession through additional training and supervision. The clinical work of providers is well-supervised by seasoned clinicians to insure consistent quality.

Why a low-income Clinic?

Many families with restricted incomes have found mental health services priced out of reach. Samaritan Center of Puget Sound has responded to this need by creating the Clinic, a resource particularly for those who have very limited funds to provide for their counseling needs. The Clinic emphasizes quality of service at the same time it provides affordable services.

The Clinic is for those whose financial resources might restrict them from getting wanted or needed therapy. The Clinic's fee scale is designed to meet the needs of very low income clients, offering therapy services below usual agency minimum fees. Call to find out if you and your family qualify for counseling in the Clinic.

Our therapists are ready to help you with concerns such as:

- depression and anxiety
- couple and family relationships
- child and adolescent issues
- parenting
- physical, sexual or emotional abuse
- transitions and life changes
- self-esteem, self-image and identity
- addictions and codependency
- grief and loss
- marriage and commitment
